computer lab funded by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act

(WIOA). The lab will be used as a mobile career center that will deliver a variety of job skills and development services to the Northwest Georgia region, while increasing awareness of the services provided by Region 1 Northwest Georgia Workforce Development Board and its partner agencies. More services will be provided to a greater number of individuals and employers, thereby enabling individuals to achieve their highest potential; ensuring employers have the skilled workers they need to compete effectively in the global economy; and capitalizing on the untapped potential of underemployed and discouraged workers, youth and other job seekers with special needs.

Even with seven one-stop career centers serving the fifteen-county region, most cities are more than twenty miles away, and travel to the centers can place an undue hardship on those with limited incomes and access to transportation. In addition, use of the mobile career center will increase the presence of the WIOA program, provide access to those with disabilities that are not able to travel to the career centers, and increase access to training opportunities through the availability of classroom training. Distance from an education provider can be a barrier to those with limited incomes or who are receiving unemployment insurance benefits.

As new endeavors are identified to meet WIOA requirements (such as enhancing digital literacy skills and financial literacy) and closer relationships are developed between partners, the list of services and target groups will expand. For the immediate future, potential uses are anticipated for:

- Employer recruitment, on-site contract finalization
- Individual training GEDs, on-line classroom training
- Work-based learning OJT, apprenticeships, internships
- Skills assessments
- On-site employment applications, résumés
- Detention and juvenile justice centers GEDs, on-line training
- Youth services
- Staff and partner training (LMI, Data Analysis, Webinars, etc.)
- Layoff Aversion/Incumbent Worker Training
- Rapid Response (layoffs and closings)
- Special projects
- Career Advisement, Career Pathway Exposure
- Job/Career Fairs
- Core Services/Partner Referrals
- Military/National Guard Re-entry
